#### 1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Pathfinders Trials MCC hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct Pathfinders Denmark Two Day Trial Trial at the 410 Tindale rd, on 03-Apr-26 to 05-Apr-26 as per Permit Applications applied for.

#### 2. JURISDICTION:

The above mentioned event has been authorised by Motorcycling Western Australia (MWA) who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number TR/26/I/23974 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia licences.

The event will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport General Competition Rules (GCR's) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by Motorcycling WA. By entering this Event all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

If an International Meeting Number (IMN) is approved, competitors with comparable licenses from another FMN who have obtained written clearance and provide verification of personal FIM insurance to a standard accepted by Motorcycling Australia are also eligible to compete.

#### 3. ENTRIES:

Entries open forthwith and close on 02-Apr-26 via Ridernet. Conditions of entries in section 27.

In the case of postponement or abandonment of the event, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Pathfinders Trials MCC, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling WA. Only entries received on the official Entry Form that are accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.

#### 4. INSURANCE:

National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability. Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees. **IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.**

#### 5. MEDICAL SERVICES:

First Aiders, Kits and defib onsite. will be in attendance prior to any on track motorcycle activity until 15 minutes after the completion of racing each day.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the event will be deemed to be 07:00 AM with the completion of the event for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

Enduro Events - Prior to competition there may be an escorted preliminary lap of the course.

Track dissatisfaction - Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can

present these concerns to the Clerk of the Course. If those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the event.

All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Trial Competition.

Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the event.

It is the competitor or parent / legal guardians' responsibility to ensure that any machine that suffers accident damage during practice or racing is repaired and will meet the required safety standards as outlined in the MOMS prior to further participation in the event.

Capacity and fuel testing may be utilised by the Scrutineer at any round to assist with machine eligibility.

Helmets are mandatory. All persons including officials using any bike, trike or quad at an event must be wearing a properly secured helmet.

## **15. RIDING NUMBERS:**

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Registered Riding Number. All Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCR's for Trial.

A rider's briefing will be held at 08:15 AM and prior to any on track motorcycle activity. It is compulsory for ALL competitors to attend. A random attendance roll call may be utilised by the Clerk of Course to determine a competitor's attendance at rider's briefing. The Clerk of Course may at his/her discretion, penalise any competitor who is called randomly at riders briefing and is proven not to be in attendance by not responding to that call.

Spectators are welcome to attend the event. There is no cost to view the event.

Spectators are to follow directions given by all event officials.

Spectators are not permitted to enter any restricted or competition areas.

With exception to service companions, animals and pets are not permitted to the property.

Please bring your own food and water as there is none onsite, It is strongly recommended to wear appropriate clothing and foot ware.

## **29. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:**

These Supplementary Regulations (Supp Regs) outline the procedures and rules governing the practice day and competition day for the Summer Series One Multiday Permit. Participants are required to adhere to these regulations for the smooth conduct of the event.

Practice Day 2.1 Practice Day 2.1 Practice will be conducted on the day preceding the competition between the hours of 0800 and 1700. Participants are encouraged to utilize this time to familiarize themselves with the course and riding conditions. An event official must be onsite during practice hours; otherwise, practice is strictly prohibited.

2.2 Practice Area Participants must sign on and practice in designated areas only (Where applicable). Any unauthorized practice outside these areas is strictly prohibited.

Competition Day 3.1 Practice Time Allocation A designated practice time will be allocated prior to the rider's briefing on the competition day. Participants must adhere to the allocated practice time and any instructions provided by the event officials.

3.2 Section Access to sections before the official start of the event is restricted to authorized officials only. Participants are not permitted to enter sections until the event commences.

General Information 4.1 Camping Availability Please note that camping facilities may not be available at all events. Participants are advised to check the event's official Facebook page for detailed information regarding camping arrangements.

**30. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS:**

All competitors should have a minimum 2kg, dry power A: B (E) class, working fire extinguishers in their pit area.
